- **Continuing Discussion of Section 34: General Code Personnel Policies** and the subsidiary Personnel Policy Manual (attached) and draft of our recommendations of changes in Section 34 Our role is to recommend changes in the Code and our rationale for these changes. The Council will make the decision.

Report from General Code Review Committee: Town Council Meeting June 1.

34 Personnel Policies: We are meeting Monday, June 15 to finalize our recommendations of changes to Section 34. Much of the work in reviewing the current policies and identifying issues that must be addressed has been done by Council member, Carolyn Saxton, as well as by Doug Cannon, also a Council member, and Ken Thompson of our committee. We have also had the advice of Marshal Reeder. Because of the coronavirus our work has been delayed. We have had two meetings in the past three weeks and will complete our report to the Council following our meeting on the 15th. We will make substantive recommendations regarding the Section 34 and advisory recommendations regarding the proposed new Personnel Handbook.

We are also reviewing fines and penalties to insure consistency and appropriate proportionality.

- **New Business**

72.04: Parking Restrictions on Recreational Vehicles

B. Temporary shall be defined as not more than a total of 30 days within a calendar year. Each day in excess of 30 days shall be consider a separate offense.

Proposal: by Marshal's Office.

1. Reduce total from 30 days to 15 days and require a permit from the Town Hall for each 24 hour period.

Rationale: The current ordinance as written in nearly impossible to enforce because it requires no permit and thus must be policed daily by someone from the Marshal's office. It is also being abused by one or more residents, resulting in complaints.

93.09: Noise Regulations B. The Following are exempted from the provisions of this section. (2) Lawn mowers, weed blowers etc., when properly muffled, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. only.

Proposal: by Marshal's Office.

1. Change hours of exemption to correspond with noise exemptions for outside contractors, i.e. 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

Rationale: standardized the hours of exemption. Again the Office has received complaints about neighbors mowing their lawns at 6:00 a.m.
